MINUTES

1. The meeting was called to order at 8:04 am by Chairman Doug Henderson

2. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: None

3. MANAGER AND STAFF REPORTS:

Airport Supervisor Sean Kienle reported that the Terminal/Hangar Relocation Project was nearing completion. The contractor has estimated that the Town will be able to occupy the buildings on Friday, February 22nd. This is to be determined by the completion of several "punch" items that are still outstanding.

Sean also reported that the RWY 11/29, TWY A/B Surface Treatment Project is in the bidding process. ADOT is responsible for the contract and there is no mobilization date at this time.

Sean Kienle also reported the following Recent Fuel Sales:

- a. January 2013: \$21,711.16 (↑ 37% over January 2012) – 4,565.33 gallons (↑ 37% over January 2012)
- b. February 2013 To Date: \$4,474.16 – 898.59 gallons

- 2011/12: \$402,750.89 (↑ 57%)
